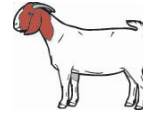

Driving Directions To Freeborn Hall

From Sacramento, take Interstate 80 West to Hwy 113 North. **From the Bay Area**, take Interstate 80 East to Hwy 113 North. From 113, take the Russell Blvd Exit and turn right (east) onto Russell. At the 4th traffic light, turn right on Howard Way. Make a left turn into the North Entry Parking Structure. Parking is FREE on weekends. After parking, walk down Howard Way towards campus.
