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### **1. California Instructional School Garden Program Grants – AB 1535**

Fifteen (15) El Dorado County school districts, representing 41 local schools, have been notified by the California Department of Education that they will be receiving California Instructional School Garden Program funding. School sites will receive \$2500 per school for garden-based learning programs. It's great news that 72% of our local school sites will receive the grants!

Many schools are curious to know when the grant funds will arrive. Award checks were sent to district/county office of education point persons on November 30, 2007 to sites that have had their county or district contacts sign and send in their award letters. The actual date of when this money will make to your school will depend on how county/district offices process and distribute the award money.

### **2. FREE! School Garden Workshop January 30, 2008**

*"Planning Your School Garden Program"*

An afterschool workshop is planned for Wednesday, January 30, 2008 in Placerville from 3:30-5:30 at the El Dorado County Office of Education. These two-hour mini-workshops will utilize several of the modules presented at the very popular workshop series held this past fall (attended by 27 local teachers!).

**Bonus!** Each attendee will receive an indoor "worm hotel" and curriculum materials to explore vermiculture and composting topics in the classroom!

This workshop is geared toward teachers, parent volunteer, community volunteers, school administrators or other garden supporters that are planning new school garden programs.

Topics will include:

- Curricular resources
- Building a support network and organizational structure for your program
- Year-round school garden guidelines and tasks
- Setting your garden goals and breaking down the steps

EDHS has developed a proposed four-year course of study and an outline of two new classes --- California Natural Resources 1 and California Natural Resources 2.
