Landscaping Can Protect Homes from Wildfire & Conserve Water During Drought

The area where homes and landscapes meet wildland vegetation can be a beautiful and quiet place to live. However, the Rim Fire is a reminder that this area, commonly called the wildland-urban interface (WUI), is also where wildfires pose the biggest risk to people and structures.

To give a little background about myself; I grew up on a small family farm in the rural Appalachian Mountains of North Carolina. As I child I gained an appreciation for the land and rural community that I grew up in, and when I left the area, I realized that I had taken a lot of things for granted. After studying at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and working with farmers, schools, and rural organizations in North and South America, I discovered a common challenge in nearly every region: to equip the youth and communities with the knowledge of how to get access to healthy food, how to live healthy lifestyles, and how to connect with the local communities. I feel both excited and fortunate to begin working with the schools and community organizations that are taking on that challenge here in the Mother Lode region.

Amador County Farm Day

Amador County Farm Day will once again host 3rd graders (including all 3rd grade split classes) in Amador County at the fairgrounds in Plymouth. On September 30th approximately 350 youth will participate in an all-day interactive learning experience where they learn about agriculture in the context of local farms, ranches, and forests. All activities are free to students and are designed to support California State Standards for third grade curriculum. Farm Day demonstrations and exhibits teach students something new about where our food, fiber, and shelter comes from.
