## Drought Decisions - Setting Priorities in your Home and Landscape

These days, many Master Gardeners are finding that wherever we go, people want to chat about how to cope with the drought. Recently, a gardening buddy shared her strategy. She said "I talk with my plants, and ask them if they are worth a five minute shorter shower." After a good laugh, I asked her if I could quote her. Why? It's because her response cuts to the chase of this article. We don't yet know how extensive the drought will be. Will we receive some much needed rain? Will cooler days reduce evapotranspiration (loss of water through leaves) from our plants? We do know that 2013 was the driest year in California since record keeping began in the 1800s, and January 2014 broke all kinds of high temperature records in Sacramento. ([Continue reading...](#))
