The SWEEP provides financial assistance in the form of grants to implement irrigation systems that reduce greenhouse gases and save water on California agricultural operations. Eligible system components include (among others) soil moisture monitoring, drip systems, switching to low pressure irrigation systems, pump retrofits, variable frequency drives and installation of renewable energy to reduce on-farm water use and energy.

Beginning Farming Academy - April 26th & 27th, 2019

UC Cooperative Extension Placer/Nevada

This is a 2-day intensive introduction to starting a small commercial farm or ranch. If you are considering starting a small ag operation in the foothills, you should attend the Academy. Learn about assessing your resources and choosing products, the basics of market-driven farming, and economic tools. You will finish with an action plan for jump-starting your operation.

This workshop does not address production practices. It is focused on marketing, business, and economic planning for profitable small farms. Local expert farmers and ranchers and UCCE Farm Advisors will help you refine your plans for your farm or ranch.

The Academy runs from 8 AM to 8 PM on Friday, and 8 AM to 5 PM on Saturday. Meal cost for the two days is \$75.

The class is limited to 15 prospective producers. Applications will open in mid-February 2019.



Sustainable Organic Gardening Workshop

On February 23, 2019, the UCCE Master Gardeners and Master Food Preservers of El Dorado County will present a low-cost workshop on **Sustainable Organic Gardening**. Our goal is to help attendees understand how easily they can create gardens that reduce food costs, improve nutrition, and enhance food security. The workshop provides a condensed version of several popular UCCE Public Education classes and is appropriate for teachers, students, scouts, church and community leaders, garden clubs, and anyone interested in growing healthy food. Our presentations are clear and accessible for beginning gardeners and informative for those who know something about organic gardening and want a stronger and more accurate scientific foundation.

We'll look at sustainability from four perspectives: how soil functions, how to create compost to improve your soil, how to choose beneficial plants that will help attract the insects you need for pollination and pest control, and how to preserve food so you can enjoy the fruits of your labor throughout the year.

Sustainable Soil
Turning Dirt in to Gold: Turning soil is one of the best things you can do as a gardener. Plants thrive in soil that is teeming with life. Learn why soil health really matters and how to work with your soils to improve plant health and reduce disease and pests.

Composting
Active Composting: Learn the best way to make compost that will enhance your garden health. We will demonstrate hot and cold methods, optimal ratios of greens and browns, aeration, moisture, and uses for the final product.

Beneficial Plants and Insects
Attracting Pollinators, Beneficial Insects, and Other Natural Predators: An ecologically sustainable garden is beautiful and able to attract and sustain pollinators and beneficial insects, reducing the need for pesticides. Learn how plant selection affects beneficial insect populations, which provide ecological benefits such as biodiversity and natural pest control. Habitat management provides a refuge for the insects during winter, and nectar and pollen resources, leading to increases in pollination and other beneficial insects.

Food Preservation
What to Do with Billions of Zucchini? Did zucchini take over your summer garden? Did neighbors have bags of zucchini on your doorstep? Did you get tired of making zucchini bread? Did you use zucchini to feed your worm bin or compost pile? There's so much more you can do with zucchini other than freezing it. Learn multiple preservation techniques and recipes to preserve zucchini next summer to enjoy throughout the year.
